Winter Weather Reminder

Please make sure your child has warm enough clothes for recess. (snow pants, coat, boots, hat and gloves).

- 11. Cold Weather Gear
- a. If temperature feels like 30 degrees or below a winter coat, hat and gloves are required to cover exposed skin. It will be at the discretion of the teacher for 5th-8th grade students.
- b. Students in grades K-5 are required to have snow pants and boots during the winter season.
- c. If temperature feels like between 30-40 degrees, students are required to have a second layer such as a coat, jacket or sweatshirt. It will be at the discretion of the outside recess teacher for 6th-8^m grade students.

5. Absences Policy

If a child is to be absent, parents should call school before 8:15 AM. Special excuses for students who need to attend an orthodontist, dentist, or doctor will be given provided the teacher is informed before the absence. The child may be required to make up the work in advance or as directed by the teacher. If a child is gone for an extended vacation, the homework is not required to be given in advance. The Hull Christian School Sickness Guidelines will be handed out at the beginning of the year and posted on our website. Please follow the guidelines. Please contact the office for additional copies. A student will be considered tardy if they arrive between 8:30-8:45. They will be considered absent if they arrive after 8:45. An unexcused absence or tardy will be issued if school has not been notified.

<u>Habitual absences</u>

- A. Communication may be made between the principal and parents when students who are absent from school, excused or unexcused, more than 5 days in a quarter.
- B. Communication may be made between the principal, parents and education committee when student who are absent from school, excused or unexcused, more than 10 days in a semester.
- C. Communication may be made between the principal, parents, education committee and School Board when student who are absent from school, excused or unexcused, more than 20 days in a semester.
- D. Habitual truancy may be reported to the appropriate county officials. Consequences for habitual truancy is at the discretion of the county juvenile court.
- E. A signed doctor's note may be requested by the school at any time if the absence are due to sickness.
